251 Organizations from 29 countries call on Salvadoran government to drop the charges against leading Water Defenders arrested on January 11

Organizaciones internacionales piden al gobierno salvadoreño que retire los cargos contra Defensores del Agua detenidos el 11 de enero [TEXTO EN ESPAÑOL ABAJO]

Washington, D.C. and San Salvador – On January 20, 251 organizations from 29 countries released the following statement:

On January 11, at the order of the Salvadoran Attorney General, police arrested five prominent Water Defenders in northern El Salvador: Miguel Ángel Gámez, Alejandro Laínez García, Pedro Antonio Rivas Laínez, Antonio Pacheco, and Saúl Agustín Rivas Ortega.

These individuals were among leaders of the [historic and successful campaign](#) that convinced the Salvadoran legislature to unanimously pass a ban on metals mining in 2017 to save that nation's rivers. In 2009, the Institute for Policy Studies (IPS) honored the coalition that several of the five helped build, the National Roundtable on Metals Mining, with IPS's Letelier-Moffitt Human Rights Award.

Today, thanks in part to its ill-advised embrace of Bitcoin, the Salvadoran government is under enormous pressure to find new revenues. The government is reportedly considering overturning the mining ban, and allowing environmentally-destructive mining. Environmental and human rights organizations in El Salvador have stated that the arrests are politically motivated as they seek to silence these Water Defenders and to demobilize community opposition at this critical moment.

The five are accused by El Salvador's Attorney General of an alleged murder over 30 years ago during the brutal civil war in El Salvador that claimed the lives of 75,000. The victims of crimes from that war, which saw a U.S.-backed dictatorship and right-wing death squads kill tens of thousands, have, for decades, been calling for justice. The current government, however, has chosen to actively uphold decades of impunity. Rather than investigate or prosecute those responsible for the dozens of cases of human rights violations and crimes against humanity that members of the Salvadoran military committed against the Santa Marta community (including the murders of the Lempa River massacre in 1980, where 30 people were assassinated and 189 were disappeared), the government is now re-victimizing the community by targeting their leaders, who have been outspoken against the policies of the current government. This further raises questions about whether the Attorney General's true motivation is to attempt to silence these Water Defenders, especially in light of the current administration's crusade to criminalize, persecute and demobilize its political opponents.

The Salvadoran movement to ban mining and the Water Defenders who made it possible have been an inspiration to communities and civil society across the globe. Over the years, hundreds of groups around the world worked with the Salvadoran Water Defenders in the successful campaign to save the country's rivers from toxic gold mining.

The undersigned organizations join in demanding that the Salvadoran government drop the charges against the five Water Defenders and otherwise release them from prison to await their trial.

EN ESPAÑOL:

Como organizaciones internacionales pedimos al gobierno salvadoreño retirar los cargos contra Defensores del Agua detenidos el 11 de enero.

Washington, D.C. y San Salvador – El 11 de enero, por orden del Ministerio Público de El Salvador, la policía arrestó a cinco destacados defensores del agua en el norte de El Salvador: Miguel Ángel Gámez, Alejandro Laínez García, Pedro Antonio Rivas Laínez, Antonio Pacheco y Saúl Agustín Rivas Ortega.

Estas personas fueron parte de los líderes de la histórica y exitosa campaña que convenció a la Asamblea Legislativa de El Salvador de aprobar por unanimidad la Ley de Prohibición de Minería Metálica de metales en 2017, para salvar los ríos de esa nación. En el 2009, el Instituto de Estudios de Políticas (IPS) honró a la coalición que varios de los cinco ayudaron a construir, la Mesa Nacional frente a la Minería Metálica, con el Premio de Derechos Humanos Letelier-Moffitt de IPS.

Hoy en día, gracias en parte a su desacertada adopción del Bitcoin, el gobierno salvadoreño está bajo una enorme presión para encontrar nuevos ingresos. Según los informes, el gobierno está considerando revocar la prohibición de la minería y permitir la minería destructiva para el medio ambiente. Las organizaciones ambientalistas y de derechos humanos en El Salvador han declarado que los arrestos tienen motivaciones políticas, ya que buscan silenciar a estos Defensores del Agua y desmovilizar a la oposición comunitaria en este momento crítico.

Los cinco están acusados por el Fiscal General de El Salvador de un presunto asesinato hace más de 30 años durante la brutal guerra civil en El Salvador que cobró la vida de 75,000 personas. Las víctimas de los crímenes de esa guerra, en la que una dictadura respaldada por los Estados Unidos y escuadrones de la muerte derechistas mataron a decenas de miles, llevan décadas pidiendo justicia. El actual gobierno, sin

embargo, ha optado por mantener activamente décadas de impunidad. En lugar de investigar o enjuiciar a los responsables de las decenas de casos de violaciones de derechos humanos y crímenes de lesa humanidad que militares salvadoreños cometieron contra la comunidad de Santa Marta (incluidos los asesinatos de la masacre del río Lempa en 1980, donde fueron asesinadas 30 personas y 189 desaparecidos), el gobierno ahora está revictimizando a la comunidad al atacar a sus líderes, quienes se han manifestado abiertamente en contra de las políticas del gobierno actual.

Esto plantea aún más dudas sobre si la verdadera motivación del Fiscal General es intentar silenciar a estos Defensores del Agua, especialmente tomando en cuenta la cruzada de la administración actual para criminalizar, perseguir y desmovilizar a sus opositores políticos.

El movimiento salvadoreño de prohibir la minería y los Defensores y Defensoras del Agua que lo hicieron posible han sido una inspiración para las comunidades y la sociedad civil alrededor del mundo. A lo largo de los años, cientos de grupos de todo el mundo trabajaron con los Defensores y Defensoras del Agua de El Salvador en la exitosa campaña para salvar los ríos del país de la tóxica minería de oro.

Las organizaciones abajo firmantes se unen para exigir la liberación de los cinco Defensores del Agua, que se retire el caso contra ellos, y al no ser así, que se les permita esperar su juicio en su comunidad.
